



### **Retention Metrics**





## **Study Status**

- As of December 31, 2017 owners have withdrawn 55 dogs and 69 dogs are deceased.
- There are 30 primary endpoint diagnoses.
- 17 dogs have died with one of the four primary cancers being studied.

### Operations

- The study team and other Scientific Programs staff participated in strategic planning sessions with the foundation's Research Oversight Committee. The final tactics will be presented as part of a foundation-wide 3-5 year strategy for consideration by the Board of Trustees.
- Audits were conducted to update erroneous spay/neuter dates, histopathology reports uploaded to patient portals, and reported Additional Veterinary Visits.
- The Canine Lifetime Health Project Oversight Committee met on October 20, 2017.
- Standard operating procedures for histopathology adjudication were drafted and tested on six cases. Full histopathology adjudication is scheduled to begin in January 2018.
- The Study Veterinarian met with leadership at Fear Free (fearfreepets.com) to discuss ways that our partnership can grow to support owner and veterinarian retention.

## Science Highlights

- Six pilot proposals were received in response to our September call. Four of them are with the Scientific Steering Committee for review.
- The second paper from the study was published

## **Events and Fundraising**

- Two separate roundtable sessions were held to better educate all foundation staff on the current state and future goals of the Golden Retriever Lifetime Study.
- \$965 was raised as part of the Fear Free Happy Homes launch. This means 193 participating or supporting owners learned about enrichment and strategies for less stressful veterinary care.
- A volunteer-driven holiday ornament sale generated \$2,700 for the study.
- Total donations this quarter supporting the study were \$322,629.00, not including partner/sponsor contributions.
